

Prescription Medicine

- Prescriptions written by your Upper Peninsula Health Plan (UPHP) doctor are provided at no cost to you – or for a small co-payment – when they are filled at pharmacies that participate with UPHP. Medicaid members 21 years of age and older should see their *Member Handbook* for full information on co-payments. There are no co-payments for Medicaid members younger than 21 years or for MIChild members.
- Some Medicines may need prior approval. They are listed on a UPHP restricted drug list. You or your doctor may ask for a list from UPHP Customer Service at 1-800-835-2556. The list is also on this website under *Pharmacy*.
- You may have small delays, because UPHP has asked for more facts to approve your medicine from your doctor. Your doctor may ask for prior approval for medicine by contacting 4D Pharmacy Management Systems. Please remind your doctor when your medicine needs prior approval.
- If a medicine does not appear on the drug list, your doctor may ask for it from 4D Pharmacy Management Systems.
- Have your UPHP identification card every time you get medicine. Medicaid members should also have their mihealth card.
- Do not pay your pharmacy for your medicine, except for your co-payment. If there is a problem, ask the pharmacist to call UPHP Customer Service.
